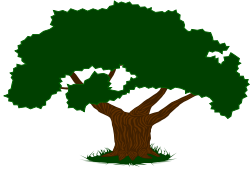

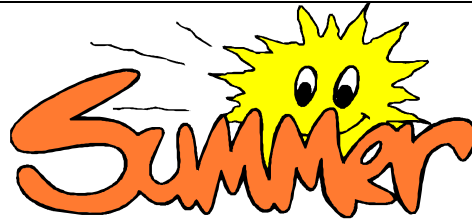

## Monday, July 4<sup>th</sup> Parade! NOON.

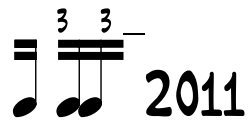
